Following on from the Day 1 May 23rd Logistics Guide, this will provide information to ensure that Day 2 of the Members Hui is a comfortable, enjoyable, and seamless experience. Please read through all sections carefully.

DAY 2 ARRANGEMENTS

Venue Access

Please ensure that you have the sticker provided to you on Day 1 when you arrive at the Treaty Grounds for Day 2 as this will provide you access to the Grounds.

Hui Schedule

Day 2 will begin at 9.30am at the Tahuaroa Function Centre see map (orange circle) with a recap of the previous day.

At 2pm approximately, we will have the HALO Art Exhibition by Gill Gatfield down at the Ngatokimatawhaorua Waka by the Whare Waka Café (see map).

Dinner will be at The Duke of Marlborough in Kororareka Russell which will start at 6pm. The ferries depart Paihia on the ½ hour from the wharf and the journey across the harbour is approximately 15 minutes. From the ferry to The Duke of Marlborough is a very short stroll.

The return ferries depart Russell on the hour with the last ferry departing at 10pm.

The attire for the evening event is smart casual with the recommendation to bring a warmer layer as the ferry ride back to Paihia could be chilly.

Transport to Russell and back

There will be transport departing from the Copthorne to the wharf at 4.45pm sharp with pick-ups on the way.

There will be transport departing from the wharf back to the Copthorne at 9.20pm (9pm ferry from Russell) with drop-offs on the way.

Attire and Weather Preparedness

Being the start of winter, we are advising to dress in layers. Most of the hui will be indoors during the day, comfortable clothing is recommended. Please check the weather forecast closer to the event date for any changes and prepare for unexpected weather conditions.
